Halcottsville artist exhibits work at Watershed offices

MARGARETVILLE, August 12, 2009 – “Artistic Nature,” an exhibition of 25 watercolors and acrylic paintings by Sharon Suess of Halcottsville, is on view at the offices of the Catskill Watershed Corporation (CWC) in Margaretville through October 9.

Visitors are welcome during business hours, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

From “Sunday Birch” to “Morning Fog,” “Winter Pines” to “Autumn Blooms,” the exhibition celebrates the astounding variety of the Catskills afield. Focusing on small segments of forest, meadow and pond -- with a special affinity for trees -- Sharon captures the color and form that make our region’s landscape so breathtaking in every season.

A resident of the Catskills since 1979, the Halcottsville artist says her paintings “represent my interpretation of the beauty that envelops all who are lucky enough to step foot in this area.” She’s an avid photographer and can often be seen walking around Lake Wawaka, camera in hand.

Sharon teaches watercolor classes geared to “People Who Don’t Paint” (beginners who have always wanted to try painting, but never got around to it).
